## Watering must be before 10:00 AM and after 4:00 PM on your designated day for watering. THURSDAY & / OR SUNDAY Watering must be before 10:00 AM and after 4:00 PM on your designated day for watering. The restrictions include use of all water sources, whether from private wells (which is what Twin Fountains uses), municipal and private water utilities and water from a pond or lake.

- □ Hand watering of trees, flowers, and gardens by hand or with a hose is allowed any time.
  - New lawns, plants and landscaping are exempt from day-of-week restrictions for the first 60 days after planting.
  - □ Vehicles, boats, and RV's may be washed once a week. However, an automatic shut-off nozzle must be used.
  - □ Violations of these restrictions are a civil infraction punishable with fines up to \$500.00


Several of the key issues are maintenance of property, pets, speeding, leasing of property & visitors. If any of these issues concern you, please re-read the



In the middle of the Garden of Eden, there was a tree that God called the tree of the knowledge of good and evil. He commanded them not to eat



That's the same for us – sin is a temptation that we all struggle with every day - but with the help of God, we can subdue it have victory over it! **To be continued...** 






The Great Egret is the largest white egret in Florida. These usually solitary birds can be found at any body of water hunting for fish, the mainstay of their Polk County diet. may residents surprised to have a living lawn ornament as Great Egrets also hunt in landscaped yards for lizards and other delicacies. They are dwarfed in size only by the ubiquitous Great Blue Heron. These large white

members of the heron family have a heavy yellow bill and black legs and feet. Breeding adults sport long lacy plumes on the back and vivid lime-green lores (the skin between the eye and the bill). These lovely plumes nearly led plumes nearly led to the Great Egret's demise as they were fashionable on women's hats in the late 1800s. Once the birds were protected, they made a good comeback and became the symbol of the National Audubon Society.


